For the second time in its over 50 year history, the IOOF Recreation Area has been closed due to extreme fire danger. The New Mexico drought which is encompassing the state has brought the closure of all National and State parks and campgrounds by the US Forest Service. Although the Recreation Area is privately owned, the decision to abide by the rules of the Forest Service was made by the Board of Governors.

Andy Shanley, Board Chairman, said " the local head of the Forest Service advised that if we stayed open, which was our choice, and a fire began on our property, we could be held financially responsible."

The Area was opened on the last weekend of April, as usual, and some repairs were done to the water system. The pump was repaired and the water meter had to be replaced. The annual work weekend, the last of June, when major repairs and projects are started was cancelled. The Annual Picnic, the last weekend of July, has been put on hold depending if the closures are lifted and if there is any rain. If it is permitted to be held, word will be sent to all lodges via calls, emails and word of mouth to share the news that the camp is open.

The drought, which has placed New Mexico at the top of the national list of driest states, has created not only fires burning throughout the state, but a shortage of water in many communities. The Recreation Area is extremely dry and, at this time, the well is sufficient for our needs. However, water conservation will have to be addressed in the future. Protecting this valuable asset should be of the most important goals of the future plans of our organization.
