New Mexico Rebekah Reporter now a Part of New Mexico History!

Through the efforts of Barbara Fix of Santa Fe IOOF Lodge #2, copies of the NMRR and selected copies of the IOOF News are now on file with the New Mexico History Museum in Santa Fe, New Mexico. In addition to past copies of the NMRR, the Rebekah Centennial Book was also included in the donation. The selected copies of the IOOF News were the ones that had articles on Thomas Wildey and Schyler Colfax. The New Mexico History Museum will now receive all regular copies of the NMRR when published and they will be placed on file for future reference.

Barbara has also done extensive research on the first Odd Fellow Lodge in New Mexico, Montezuma Lodge #1, in 1856 in Santa Fe. In the documentation, she unearthed, Montezuma Lodge and Paradise Lodge #2, also from Santa Fe, were involved in a dispute with each other as well as the Masonic Lodge regarding the cemetery that was jointly owned by the Odd Fellows and Masons. She has turned
