The End of an Era

As of December 31, 2013, four Encampments in New Mexico surrendered their charters – Deming #6, Lea (Hobbs) #10, Covenant (Clovis) #13, and Rio Grande Valley (Socorro) #18. This left Albuquerque #4 as the only remaining active Encampment in New Mexico. At the March Meetings, the Grand Encampment of New Mexico (instituted October 7, 1907) folded its tent for the final time after 107 years.

The members of the closed Encampments wishing to continue their membership will be transferred to the Albuquerque Encampment. Members of the Albuquerque Encampment have voted to join the Grand Encampment of Arizona, which is allowed by the Sovereign Grand Lodge Code subject to SGL approval.

This can be the "Beginning of the End" or a "Wake Up and Get Started" call for Odd Fellows and Rebekahs in New Mexico.
